

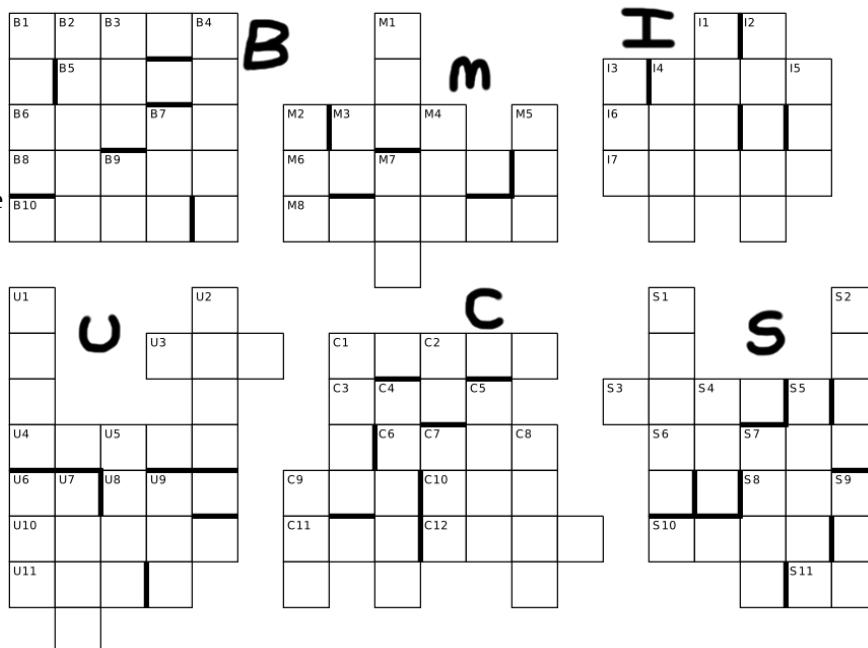
MY NEW PUZZLE

Somewhat childishly, I broke my crossword apart. Each of the pieces is a valid crossword puzzle, but by putting them together again you will find more words that can be read if viewed correctly.

The extra words will respect the already marked bars within the smaller pieces; however, bars that used to exist on the edges of the individual pieces are no longer marked, and the extra words may read across any edge.

Clues for sub-crosswords are straight clues, those for the extra words are cryptic. The extra words are in alphabetical order.

Finally, there is a natural ordering of the pieces. Arrange the letters in that order to recover the working title of this puzzle.
